# DHS Honors Veterans of Davenport

Originally, Veterans Day was called Armistice Day to honor the war dead following the armistice or truce at the end of World War I. This federal holiday is celebrated on November 11<sup>th</sup> to honor military veterans of the United States Armed Forces. Many of you may know the old saying: 11<sup>th</sup> Hour, 11<sup>th</sup> Day, 11<sup>th</sup> Month of 1918, when World War I was formally ended. At the urging of major veterans organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day in 1954 through President Eisenhower's signature.

Some of you may wonder about the difference between the annual military holidays. Memorial Day honors those who made the ultimate sacrifice while in service. Armed Forces Day is for those who are currently serving, and Veterans Day is for all who served.

While the DHS was preparing to open the museum, we found this plaque that is on display today. (You can see it on page 4 of this newsletter.) Of course, I investigated and was told that it once hung on the second floor of the Methodist Church in Davenport. I was curious about the two names on the plaque and why there was a star by their names.

These two brothers, named Algy K. and Arthur L. Bevins, died serving our country during World War I. Every name listed on the plaque are men

who were from Davenport. They include: John R. Adair, Bascom Alderman, Jack D. Brotchie, Vivian E. Davids, Raymond J. Derr, Joseph J. Farmer, Irving F. Frogner, Herbert P. Gibbs, I. Melville Huffman, Floyd F. P Krug, Harold E. Krug, Clinton V. McClurg, Jack W. McMahon, James Anson Rexford, Lawrence Henry Roehlk, Rudolph F. Roeholk, Silas B. Stewart, Lawrence F. Thompson, Frank Woods, and Henry Woods.

But I want to focus on the two brothers with the stars. As a mother, I can't conceive the amount of pain their parents experienced losing two children at the same time. The story of how this happened begins with their enlisting in the Coast Guard. They were assigned to the USS Tampa, a cutter which was on a convoy to the Irish Sea. They entered a cloud bank or fog and the cutter exploded. It was torpedoed by a German U-boat. Everyone was killed instantly on September 26, 1918. They had written a letter to his mother the week prior, saying that they were safe.. Life is so precious!


and 100% of the proceeds go to the upkeep of our Museum.



# Davenport's *Out-of-a-Box* Home

If you would like to step back in time and smell the peach blossoms, stand in front of the Bozeman House this coming Spring. It's Davenport's only Sears house-in-a-box home. According to Paul Catala of *The Ledger*, "from 1908 to 1940, between 70,000 and 75,000 homes in the United States were built using the mail-order Sears, Roebuck and Co. Modern Homes program." (1/16/18.) Davenport's Bozeman House is one of them.

It was built in 1925 from a box of supplies. Because many Sears homes were located near train lines, it's estimated that the Bozeman House was most likely delivered by train.

While it is true that the Bozeman House is Davenport's only Sears home left in the area (there were several here at one time), the next closest Sears home is in Lake Wales at 219

East Sessoms Avenue, only a 15 -minute drive from historic Davenport.

The Bozeman House is currently owned by David & Joyce Hunter. Before the Hunter's grabbed a hold of this gem, it was owned by a locally well-known resident named Myrtle "Granny" Bozeman.

Walking up to the Bozeman House, you'll be greeted by a wrap-around porch, the original door, and a spacious indoors that includes built-in cabinetry in the dining area, an ice box door, a formal room, the original fireplace, and the original oak floors. It sits on an acre and is skirted by a productive peach orchard, chickens in a big ole coup out back, and some bee hives to make it all authentic.
